Welcome to Little Adventurers

Our Mission

At Little Adventurers Nursery we believe each child's unique needs must always be at the heart of our ethos and practice.

We believe in giving each child our utmost care and the best of our expertise so they grow into confident, happy and competent little people who love learning.

Our Ethos

We believe passionately that each child, with differing needs and interests, should be loved and supported as they grow. We know that children will thrive best in their learning if they feel emotionally secure, so we work very hard to promote warm friendships with staff and other children and to offer plenty of creative opportunities to learn through play.

At Little Adventurers we aim to support a rich childhood, responding to the individual needs of every child through relationships that are loving and supportive.

Early Learning at Little Adventurers

The Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) is the government framework that guides the early years sector in ensuring children learn and develop well.

The EYFS states "a secure, safe and happy childhood is important in its own right. Good parenting and high quality early learning together provide the foundation children need to make the most of their abilities and talents as they grow".

At Little Adventurers our aim is to support children in learning the building blocks for life. All that they learn in these formative years will form the vital foundations for future learning and our role is to ease their path towards independence and equip them for the journey ahead.

We want to ignite children's curiosity and make learning fun, through play based investigation, exploration and discovery!

Children under three, (Discoverers and Explorers) will learn about themselves and about being with others. They will learn the fundamentals of understanding, speaking and listening and will enjoy lots of active play (these are called the Prime areas of learning as they underpin all other areas of learning).

Older children in Adventurers who are more ready to learn about the wider world, will learn about early literacy and foundational maths concepts through fun and stimulating child adult initiated activities.

The 2 to 3 year olds will continue to explore the world around them, both inside and outdoors. Our staff will support each child's growing independence and developing language skills by offering fun experiences that promote confidence and self-esteem. As children mature their social skills develop so opportunities to explore friendships with others and learn about sharing and turn taking will be an important feature in this room. Time to play with older children is important too so that they can learn from children who have greater understanding and knowledge. While their safety is ensured by the attentive staff, they will be encouraged to find out for themselves, have a go and learn from each other.

In Adventurers the older children will continue to investigate the wider world following their own path of discovery and using resources that invite experimentation. Friendships will develop, essential skills will be learnt and positive attitudes fostered, like perseverance, independence and motivation. By giving children space, time and quality resources, we know that children's bodies and brains will be stimulated and learning will take place. Looking for worms, creating with sand, planting vegetables and building with blocks are essential elements of an exciting early childhood learning experience.



Our Nursery Team

Our staff are hand chosen for their professional, caring and dedicated approach to childcare. Our staff team hold a variety of qualifications including: Early Years Professional Status; Montessori Nursery Teaching Diploma; NNEB; NVQ level 2 and 3. A significant number of staff are first aid trained, ensuring that each child's health and safety is maintained at all times. Little Adventurers is committed to furthering the professional development of our staff team through ongoing and pertinent training courses that support them further in their caring role.

Each child will be supported by a key person, who becomes the special person dedicated to developing secure friendships, meeting each child's needs and working closely with parents.

Staff are supported by the deputy manager and manager, both of whom have years of experience and expertise in many aspects of early childhood.

Little Adventurers nursery has been built to the highest specification and solely with children in mind. The safety and wellbeing of each individual child has been thought about when designing and building each aspect of the premises.

From our bespoke kitchenette in the baby room to the colour scheme on each wall, selected specifically to help encourage development, our remit has been to offer the greatest possibility for discovery, exploration and adventure in an environment that promotes positive and relaxed learning.

Each room has child-sized toilets, low level sinks and paper towel dispensers offering children ample opportunity to learn about self-care and independence without having to leave the comfort of their play room.

The garden has been designed to incorporate areas for quiet and active play and sensory exploration. Children spend time in the garden each day climbing, building, reading stories or playing in our hand-made mud kitchen. Through play based activities children learn valuable lessons about balance, early literacy, problem solving and getting on with others, supported by sensitive and encouraging staff.

Each room contains high quality, often wooden resources - ensuring that children do not spend all day surrounded only by plastic toys. We recognise that while plastic is durable and suitable for lots of little hands to use, resources made of more interesting textures promote sensory exploration and creativity which stimulates brain development.





Working with Parents

At Little Adventurers we recognise that as parents you are the expert on your child, so we want to do everything we can to work closely with you to ensure your child's needs are met.

When you visit you will want to ask lots of questions so that you feel secure with the people who are being left to care for your child. We will ask you to tell us all about your child- their routines, their likes and dislikes, their favourite toys – anything that helps us to know and support them better.

We ask you to visit at least twice to familiarise your child with the nursery. This will be time for you and your child to get to know their new key person and to see what we do. When they start with us we encourage you to leave a familiar toy or comforter from home to help them settle and will keep you informed of their time with us.



Because evidence shows that the involvement of parents in their children's learning results in longer-term benefits for the child and parent we want to involve you and keep you informed in all we do. We do this in a variety of ways including:

- Informal verbal feedback
- Communication books for the youngest children
- A learning journal of photos, pictures, observations and art masterpieces
- Regular progress reviews
- Regular newsletters with ideas for games and activities that can be enjoyed at home

It's important to us that your child's individual needs and emotional wellbeing are being looked after in the best possible way and with the highest quality of care so we welcome your input and suggestions throughout their time with us.

Learning to share and enjoy meals together from a young age has shown to provide many positive benefits that carry through to adulthood and is often a ritual that we appreciate and enjoy more as we get older. It is no surprise therefore that meal times at Little Adventurers are very important; we also understand that healthy eating and nutrition during the early years is critical to child development. Having fresh meals cooked for our children each day was something which we felt strongly about when developing our nursery. Our Chef will follow nutritional guidelines set out by the Caroline Walker Trust to support nurseries in providing healthy, balanced diets for young children.



Meal Times

A light breakfast of cereals and toast will be served between 7.30am and 8.45am where children will be encouraged to serve themselves with as much support as they need.

Children will stop for a community snack time mid-way through each morning and afternoon session, encouraging children to listen and chat to each other and develop social skills. Snack will consist of healthy food including fruit, toast, crackers and cheese. Babies will follow their home routines wherever possible.

Older children will be encouraged to be involved in preparing and serving snack in their room which will support independence and self-help skills along with a sense of belonging.

We stop for a tasty and nutritious home cooked lunch at 11.45am, which will consist of a main dish, a side dish of vegetables, a dessert and a drink, all cooked in our own nursery kitchen by our chef. Nursery lunches will follow a healthy balanced rolling menu, which will be reviewed and updated regularly by our chef who understands the nutritional needs of young children.

Tea is provided in the late afternoon (about 4.00pm) consisting of soup, beans on toast, sandwiches or similar healthy option, with fresh fruit and something sweet.

Individual dietary and cultural requirements will be catered for wherever possible and will be discussed and reviewed with parents regularly. Please do come and talk to us if you have any specific dietary requests or questions.

OPENING TIMES & SESSIONS

Little Adventurers is open from 7.30am to 6.30pm Monday to Friday each week.

We also offer half day sessions from 7.30am to 1pm and 1pm to 6.30pm.

The nursery is open throughout the year, except bank holidays and the nursery will be closed during the week between Christmas and New Year.

To ensure continuity of care for children we ask that children attend for a minimum of 2 full days or 3 half days per week.
